SAMUEL WHATLEY

Samuel Whatley was born in perhaps what was known then as Bute^(?)/Granville County, North Carolina, March 2, 1762, the son of William Whatley (b.c. 1725; d. Cherokee Corner, Georgia, c. 1776) and Mary Edwards Whatley. He was in his early teens when his family moved to Wilkes County, Georgia, from North Carolina, 1775-6. His father was a Surveyor and was surveying land with his (William's) brother, Wilson, when they were killed by Indians. Samuel's mother and the four children remained in Wilkes County, Georgia. Samuel was fourteen years of age when his father was killed and he was left with the responsibility for caring for his mother and the three other children on their farm. The sketch of Samuel Whatley in Campbell's GEORGIA BAPTISTS states that Samuel was the oldest of the children.

Around this time, Samuel volunteered and served, as a Private, under Col. Elijah Clark, Capt. Micajah Williamson, and other Revolutionary patriots. His service in the Revolution was particularly unique (ref. "Georgia Baptists", Campbell; "A Gazeteer of Georgia", Sherwood, 1860; Pension File of Samuel Whatley and Catherine Whatley, National Archives, Washington, D. C.); on one occasion, when he was with a company of mounted infantrymen, he was required to march in silence about twenty-five miles, during a freezing winter night. Being thinly clad, he was almost overcome by the cold and at the end of the trip, he was taken from his horse in a speechless and almost unconscious state. In the battle of the siege of Augusta, when the whigs were defeated, he and some fellow soldiers were required to swim the Savannah River, and being almost drowned, he had to be pulled from the river by his fellow soldiers. On another occasion, when he became separated from his company, and again, almost destitute of clothing, he had to spend the night in a tree top. The following morning, he followed a herd of swine to a main road where he chanced to meet his company, and was taken on his Captain's horse back to the camp. Several months later (December 10, 1781), he was taken prisoner in the Battle of Long Cane, South Carolina, after having been wounded by a musket ball (he never fully recovered from this and lost part of the use of his left arm). While the wound was still open, the Tories made one or two attempts to hang him but were unable to find a suitable rope. Consequently, they delivered him to the British at Ninety-Six. His wound was not treated until the third day. (The night before he was taken by the Tories, he had remained in the woods, and while suffering excruciating pain, he was attacked by three wolves from which he narrowly escaped with his life. Driven by hunger the following morning, he made his way to the residence of a widow where he was discovered and taken prisoner by the Tories.) During the four or five months that he remained a prisoner of the Tories, he amused himself, and the British Officers, by singing "Liberty Songs". Following his release, he returned to the home of his mother in Wilkes County; where he went to school for a while. During the remainder of the war, he frequently engaged in short skirmishes against the

enemy, but did not serve regularly with the regular army. He served in the Battle of Kettle Creek, which is said to have marked the turning point of the war. The battle was apparently fought near his home, and the homes of his future in-laws, the Anglins, and several of his Anglin brothers-in-law also fought in the Battle.

In the Spring of 1782, several months after his wound was inflicted, he married Catharine Anglin, the red-haired, twenty year old, orphaned daughter of James Anglin. She was born May 10, 1762 in Orange County, North Carolina. [Her father died in 1777, and is buried in Wilkes County, Georgia. James Anglin was, supposedly, born in Ireland, although, the Anglins are thought to be originally from France, as some Anglins came to this country directly from France. Prior to settling in Orange County, North Carolina, and later in Wilkes County, Georgia, James Anglin had lived in Bath County, Virginia. His wife, perhaps, died in Orange County, North Carolina, where James Anglin had operated a wagon in the government service, and perhaps was a farmer, also. Catharine, being the only daughter and the youngest child, was in her early teens when her mother died.] (ref. Whatley Family MSS, Main Reading Room, Georgia Archives) Catharine and Samuel lived on land which he took up as Head Rights in Wilkes County, Georgia (he eventually owned around one thousand acres in Wilkes and Washington Counties), and lived in the vicinity of Hardins Creek where he farmed for many years. Through the influence of Silas Mercer, he became a Baptist minister, and became active in several churches in that area of Georgia. He was ordained a deacon of Phillips Mill Church on May 8, 1802. Minutes of that church mention him several times; one entry shows that on June 10, 1826, he was chosen as a delegate to the General Meeting at Bethel Church. Ornan Whatley, who is thought to have been an uncle, gave land for the construction of a church and he, along with others of the area, constructed the Whatley's Mill Church, which later became known as the Bethesda Baptist Church, then located in Wilkes County, Georgia, now in Greene County. Although he was active in the affairs of this church, it is not known if he served as a Pastor. There is a plaque attached to the church, which bears his date of death as 1820, however, Samuel is not buried in the vicinity of this church, and did not die in the year 1820. He died at his home October 3, 1826 in Wilkes County, Georgia, where he is buried in a marked grave. In addition to the Whatley's Mill Church, he erected a school house on Hardins Creek (ref. Deed Book XX, Wilkes County, dtd. 1808. This deed also mentions one David Whatley, however, Samuel's son, David, was not of age in 1808, and it is not known what the relationship of the David mentioned in the deed is to Samuel). Samuel died in the sixty-fifth year of his life and perhaps one of his last deeds, as Minister of the Gospel, was to perform the marriage of his son, Willis. Samuel was a very tall man, over six feet, and weighed more than two hundred pounds. Although he was considered an eccentric person, he was a man of a generous and noble nature as one of the words used to describe him was humility (ref. "A Gazetteer of Georgia"). His wife was also of a controversial disposition (ref. her letters in her Pension File in the National Archives, Washington, D.C.). She considered herself a "chip off the old block" (meaning her father); she was a determined and

stubborn person. Although her husband was to become one of the early Baptist Ministers of his area, she never joined his church and was not known to have belonged to any church, but she was considered a Christian and religious person. She perhaps took more interest in his affairs outside the home after his death. She outlived him by some thirty years.

After Samuel's death, his widow continued to live in the home, in Wilkes County, Georgia, with her son, Seaborn Jones Whatley, who apparently was away frequently, because he was a surveyor, as was his grand-father and several of his brothers. When Catharine's daughter, Catharine A. (Whatley) Livingston, and her son-in-law, Taliaferro Livingston, died or were killed and left two small daughters orphaned, Catharine took them into her household, caring for them until their marriages. Around that time, being seventy one years of age, her son, James, had a large two story house built for her near his Main Plantation in (then) Pike County, Georgia, near Barnesville. So, in 1833, with her husband and several of her children deceased and her other children having homes of their own, she moved with the two Livingston granddaughters and her household staff of slaves (she was later to have twelve to maintain the household in Pike County) from Wilkes County, Georgia perhaps never to return. All of the lands in Washington County and Wilkes County, Georgia were sold except the original place where she had lived, and where perhaps the graves of husband, daughters, and other family members were located. Before moving, she arranged for her youngest son, Seaborn Jones Whatley, to be appointed Guardian of the two Livingston orphans and bequests to members of her family, including her slaves which in the event of death were to go to her daughter, Susannah (Whatley) Poore. However, it does not appear that her will was ever probated, and there is no record to indicate that her daughter, Susannah, received anything from her estate or the estates of her brothers, James and Wilson. Catharine's slaves went to her son, James, and his will divided them between the two Livingston orphans, whom they had raised. Sometime after the two Livingston orphans were married and Catharine became too feeble to remain in her large house, her son, James, built a small house for her on the grounds of his Main Plantation house this was to become her home until her death, August 7, 1857. (Catharine's son, William, bought the Main Plantation House when James died in 1856). She was buried nearby in the family cemetery of Mount Zion Baptist Church. (The church had perhaps been established by her son, James; the cemetery was established by his will). She was approximately ninety-six years of age when she died, and had out-lived most of her children. (Her letters in the National Archives prove that she possessed a remarkable mind, a sharp memory and intellect, an Irish persistence and stubbornness up until the very end. Her letters span several decades). The Tax Records of Pike County indicate that she continued to hold title to the old home place in Wilkes County for she paid taxes on that property until her death.

The house which was built for Catharine in Pike County, and

she moved into in 1833, still stands near Barnesville, Georgia (now in Lamar County). It is the most imposing house of its period in Lamar County. Built originally in the shape of an "L" the square white wooden columns extended from the porch to the top of the second story. The kitchen which was separate from the main house has been attached, making the house now a "T" shape. Catharine's son, Wilson, owned the house after her death and he and his brother, William, lived there until William moved over to the home of daughter, Mary Ann (Whatley) Coley, in Alexander City, Alabama (Tallapoosa County). Wilson Whatley, a bachelor, lived there until, nearing death, he moved into the household of his nephew, Samuel Jones Whatley. Perhaps in return for caring for him, he gave the old house to the wife of Samuel Jones Whatley, Isabella (Harp) Whatley. After his death, the property was sold and ownership moved outside the "Whatley" family. (ref. "History of Lamar County, Georgia" and Mrs. Mary Meeks of Barnesville, Georgia).

1. SUSANNAH WHATLEY

Susannah Whatley, b.c. 1783, Wilkes County, Georgia, married Poor (also spelled "Poe" and "Poore"), perhaps, brother of Lou Frances (E) Poor who married her brother, David A. Whatley. Little is known of Susannah Whatley Poor. As two of her daughters are known to have married in Monroe County, Georgia, it is assumed that she lived around there, also (or what was then Monroe County). She is not mentioned in the wills of her brothers and it is thought that she was deceased by 1856. She was still living in August 1830 when her mother, Catharine Anglin Whatley wrote her will in Wilkes County, Georgia. Known issue:

(1) Charity Poor b. ____: married William Prewett (Pruitt), Monroe County, Georgia, November 2, 1824 (ref. Monroe County, Ga. Marriage Records). Issue unknown.

(2) Elizabeth Poor b.c. 1805 married (1) Pleasant Warner, Monroe County, Ga., September 8, 1827 (ref. Monroe County, Ga. Marriage Records); (2) Joshua Taylor: (3) _____ Gordon. In 1854, when she was a "Taylor", she was living in Fayette County, Georgia; around 1856, she received at least six slaves and one hundred fifty acres from the estate of a deceased uncle, James Whatley. By 1858, she was apparently a widow and living in Pike County, Ga., on this property next door to her (step) son, Llewellyn Taylor (b.c. 1832, d. 1862). In 1870, she was still living next door to a (step) son, Joshua Taylor (Jr.?) or he had moved into her household. (ref. 1870 Federal Census of Pike County, Georgia). Issue known:

(A) Susan (Susannah?) Warner b.c. 1831 d.?, married _____ Sutton (ref. Annual Returns, Estate of her Mother's uncle, Wilson Whatley). She perhaps moved away by December 1884, when this estate was finally in the process of being settled; she could not be located and her share went to her sister, Laura. Issue unknown.

(B) Laura Warner b.c. 1832-4 married Sherod (Sherwood) Harper, son of Sherod (Sherwood) Harper of Pike County, Ga., Sept. 9, 1849 (Upson County, Ga.): issue known:

1. Louisia (A. or E?) Harper b.c. 1851, Pike Co., Ga., married James Brooks, 1871, and is thought to have lived near Meansville, Ga. Vege (?), Georgia Griffin or Atlanta, Ga. Issue not known.
2. Margaret C. Harper b.c. 1853-5 married W. F. Malaier, Pike Co. Ga. Issue unknown.
3. Sarah Elizabeth Harper ("Becky") b.c. 1857; married c. 1876, Green B. Allen, son of Green Allen (thought to be brother of Egbert West Allen, who married Martha Ann Amelia Livingston, daughter of Catharine (Whatley)

Livingston and Taliaferro Livingston): supposedly died without issue.

4. Sherwood R. Harper b.c. 1860; perhaps died between 1860-70.
5. Wilson Harper b.c. 1861.
6. David Harper b.c. 1863; worked for the Experimental Station at Griffin, Ga. Nothing further is known.
7. John Harper b.c. 1865; perhaps m. Ella Ellis, Pike Co., Ga., sometime between 1884-89 (ref. p. 358, Pike County Marriage Records).
8. Reuben Harper b.c. 1869.
9. Seaborn Harper b.c. 1873.

(C) Joshua W. Taylor (Jr.?) b.c. 1822 (step-son) m. Martha E. (?): mentioned in 1870 Census, Pike County, Georgia; 1880 Pike County, Georgia issue known:

1. John T. Taylor b.c. 1853 m. Elizabeth Whetley, daughter of Seaborn C. Whatley.
2. Nancy Alla (Allafair?) Taylor b.c. 1855.

(D) Llewellyn E. Taylor b.c. 1832 perhaps killed in the Civil War, 1862. His estate was administered by Francis Reviere. He served with his cousins in Co. H, 44 Brigade, Dales Army of Northern Virginia. (see "History of Lamar County").

(E) Frances M. Taylor b.c. 1838.

(F) Mary A. Taylor b.c. 1843.

(3) Wilson W. Poor b.c. 1822; m. Allafair G. Shehee, daughter of Sherwood S. Shehee, one of the pioneers of Pike County, Georgia (ref. "History of Lamar County"): mentioned as being in Pike County, Georgia, March 9, 1843 (see Pike County Marriage Records); he

perhaps served in the Civil War as "Wilson W. Poe", Captain of "Poe's Company". His daughter inherited his share of the estate of his late uncle, Wilson Whatley, so he was, perhaps, deceased by 1884. (However this may not be true, for there were heirs of Wilson living who should have inherited from that estate who were not mentioned in the Annual Returns. For example, Wilson had two living brothers: Seaborn Jones Whatley living in Harris County, Georgia; William Whatley living in Tallapoosa County, Alabama; while Wilson's estate was supposedly being settled and assets distributed among heirs.) Issue known:

A. Allafair G. Poor b. ____: m. ____ Jones; she was perhaps living out of the area when the estate was finally settled, 1884. Nothing further known.

Was he perhaps married twice? It is also said that he served for a while as Mayor of Houston, Texas, and that he raised a large family and has descendants living in the Houston, Texas, area. Issue unknown.
6. Laura Luvinia ("Beenie") Whatley, b. January 31, 1860; m. William J. Vickers, Pike County, Ga., March 14, 1878; lived in Spaulding Co., Ga.; buried in the old Meansville, Ga. Cemetery in Pike Co., Ga., near the Old Whatley Cemetery, Piedmont Dist. (now Lamar Co.); Issue known:
 - (a) Anna Vickers; m. _____ Alexander.
7. Wilson S. Whatley, b. March 17, 1861; (see Family Bible); m. (Mrs.) Margaret Cassandra Taylor November 16, 1879, Pike Co., Ga. (she was dau. of Joshua W. Taylor who was (step) son of Elizabeth (Poor/Poe/Poore) (Warner) (Taylor) Gordon. It is said that he moved sometime after 1880 to Texas (ref. Miss Lucille Whatley) or Oklahoma (ref. Mr. Otis Marsden Whatley); Issue known:
 - (a) Lelia Whatley; m. James Marshall, Pike Co., Ga.; moved to Texas; thought to have had two daughters.
- (2) Son b.c. 1805-10 (second child of David and Lou Frances Poor Whatley); still living in 1820.
- (3) Daughter b.c. 1810-20; still living in 1820; did she marry or die between 1820-30 (?).
- (4) Rebecca C. Whatley b.c. 1810-20; married Henry C. Spier, Pike County, Ga. February 15, 1844 (see Pike Co., Ga. Marriage Records). He was living next door to David A. Whatley's family in 1840 (ref. 1840 Census) with his widowed mother, apparently, and younger brothers and sisters. He was listed as Head of Household then, as he was apparently of age. It is not known if Rebecca had children by Henry C. Spier. In 1908, she was reportedly living in Fayetteville, Ga. (ref. Whatley Family notes of Dr. Ira Webster Porter; she is also mentioned in Will of James Whatley, 1856, Pike County, Georgia.
- (5) Daughter (birthdate unknown); m. _____ Smith (probably but unproven). There is mention of her name in papers of Wilson Whatley, son of Rev. Samuel Whatley.
- (6) John M. D. Whatley, b.c. 1824 in Georgia; m. Drucilla Blair (b.c. 1825, Ga.) in Pike County, Georgia, December 21, 1844.

By 1850, he and his family were living in Fayette County, Ga. (see mention of him in Will of James Whatley, 1856, Pike Co., Ga.); by 1860, he and his family were living in Talladega Co., Alabama; by 1880, living (with second wife?) in Tallapoosa Co., Ala. near Dadeville, Ala. Issue known (see 1880 Census, Tallapoosa Co., Ala.);

3. WILLIAM WHATLEY

William Whatley was born May 12, 1787, Wilkes County, Georgia; married Elizabeth Harper (b. April 24, 1790; d. Jan. 12, 1865), Jones County, Georgia; buried in marked grave in the family cemetery near the site of the old home at Hillsboro, Georgia. The house where William and Elizabeth lived apparently was burned, and now only the old magnolia trees stand. It is not known where William received his education. It is thought that around the time he moved to Jones County, he was a Surveyor or Farmer. However, his primary interest became that of Education and he remained an Educator until his death. He and his brother, Wilson, established the Farmers Academy, in Jones County. As the county prospered (it was to become one of the wealthiest counties of Georgia until the Civil War. (ref. 1850 Federal Census, 1860 Federal Census), the farms became "plantations" and the name of Farmers Academy was duly changed to "Planters Academy". It was a two story wooden structure and was burned when the Union Troops passed through that part of Georgia. It is not known if William's house was burned at that time also. One of the most prominent of their pupils was Alexander Stephens, who became Vice President of the Confederacy and served as Governor of Georgia, etc. William Whatley continued correspondence with him until his death, however, their letters are no longer extant. Another friend of William Whatley was Daniel Pratt, who became an architect among other things and designed many of the mansions around Clinton, Georgia. Daniel Pratt also moved to Alabama and established the town of Prattville, Alabama. William Whatley would on occasions accompany him on his large boat on Alabama rivers to Mobile, etc. After Planters Academy was burned and after the death of his wife and perhaps, all of his children living in Jones County, William moved temporarily over to Pike County with his brother, Wilson Whatley, where they devoted most of their time to disposing of the estate of their brother, James Whatley, and managing properties in Alabama and Georgia that had been left them. Eventually, William moved over to Alexander City, Alabama, and lived with his daughter, Mary Ann (Whatley) Coley, until his death, February 22, 1876. He would spend his afternoons sitting under the trees near the house and with his cane, he would carve letters of the alphabet into the dirt for his grandchildren and his great-grandchildren, as they watched the building of the railroad across the Coley property. He apparently died intestate, having disposed of his properties during his lifetime. It is said that William served in the War of 1812. Issue:

Partridge (brother of Jesse), and Sarah Jane (Whatley) Partridge (wife of John A. Partridge) are buried in the family cemetery behind the old home of John A. Partridge, near Greenville, Georgia.

obtained from the estates also. He had several plantations in Tallapoosa County, Alabama; also cotton gin, grist mill and saw mill. His main home plantation was located across the Elkahatchee Creek from Alex City. In 1895, he went to Texas and bought a farm near Gorman, Texas (Eastland County).

Lucinda went back to Alexander City to spend Christmas with her children by Mr. Hunt and died there a few days after she arrived, about 1898, perhaps at the home of Mittie (Hunt) Goggans and Dr. James Goggans. She is buried in the family lot of Dr. James A. Goggans in Alexander City, Ala. William H. Whatley died in 1900 at the age of 70 and is buried in Gorman, Texas, in a grave near the graves of his "Harper" cousins (who went from Camp Hill, Tallapoosa County, Ala.), who also settled in Gorman, Texas; Issue:

4. JAMES WHATLEY

James Whatley was born May 20, 1789 in Wilkes County, Georgia; bachelor; died July 31, 1856; buried in Mt. Zion Cemetery, Lamar County, Georgia. He was commissioner of Pike County, Georgia Academy in 1823; he was also a wealthy planter. Tax records show that in 1851, he owned 47 slaves and that his acreage in Georgia exceeded 11,000 acres, located in nine counties. In 1844, Wilson Whatley surveyed hundreds of acres of land for his brother, James, in Chambers and Tallapoosa Counties in Alabama. He raised and educated a foster son, James Greene (Beasley) Whatley, who became a doctor. (See chart of Susan Jane Whatley, daughter of Willis Whatley.)

Wilson Whatley was born October 16, 1791; bachelor; surveyor; planter; teacher; died February 21, 1875. He is buried at Mount Zion Cemetery, Lamar County, Georgia.

.No information is known about this sixth child of Samuel Whatley as of March __, 1975.

7. WILLIS WHATLEY

Willis Whatley, son of Rev. Samuel Whatley (1762-1826) and Catharine (Anglin) Whatley (1762-1857), was born in Wilkes County, Georgia in 1796; grew up in Wilkes County, Georgia; and when he was around 30 years of age, he and his father, a Baptist Minister, went over to Taliaferro County, Georgia, where he was married to Lucy Saxon (Sexton) by his father. (Lucy Saxon was a daughter of Wiley and Mary Saxon. Lucy was born c. 1807, and died June 12, 1877 at the home of her daughter, Susan Jane Whatley Collier, at the Rock, Georgia.) Apparently, after their marriage, Willis and Lucy moved over to Wilkes County to City of Washington, for their first two children were born there. They had five children, however, the names of only four are known. Sometime between 1831-1840, they moved over to Pike County, Georgia, and it is probable that Willis died there in the 1840's (although one source states he may have died in Williston, South Carolina). Living in Pike County in the 1840's were many of Willis' relatives, including his wealthy bachelor brother, James Whatley; his mother, Catharine (Anglin) Whatley; and some of Lucy (Saxon) Whatley's Saxon and Harper relatives. Issue:

On April 9, 1846, she married Christopher Columbus Watts (b. 1823) in Pike County, Georgia. There were no children of this marriage. After his death, she married James Ferguson, also a farmer living in Pike County, and about Feb. 1870, their only child was born. She inherited considerable property from the estate of her uncle, Wilson Whatley (who had inherited from the estate of his brother James), and purchased around one thousand acres of land from that estate. She and James Ferguson lived in a large two story antebellum affair which burned. The son, John, inherited over one thousand acres from his mother (James Ferguson had died before his wife). Issue:

Samuel Jones died Nov. 24, 1911, a year following the death of his wife, in Atlanta, Ga., at the home of his daughter, Lillie Lee Whatley. He is also buried in the cemetery at Meansville, Ga. When his uncle, James Whatley, died in 1856, he inherited "one-twelfth of property not disposed of in ..will" (as James had "around 50,000" acres of land in Georgia and Alabama at the time of his death, his share was considerable). He also purchased some land from other heirs of that estate and by age 30, was a relatively wealthy planter. He served in the Civil War for around two years. He and Isabelle had 13 children:

Susan Jane Whatley was the only niece of James Whatley to inherit a substantial part of his land holdings and it may be that she was at that time (in 1854 she was 20 years of age) "promised" to Dr. James G. Whatley, and because of this James gave her (even though when he wrote his will, she was still legally an "infant") an unusually large portion (when compared with that which he gave to other nieces). She inherited many slaves and a "gold watch worth one hundred dollars" and "one-twelfth part of the balance of my estate ..". Five months before James Whatley died, Susan Jane married (1)(Dr.) James G. Whatley. However, she was only married to him for four years; as he died in the Spring of 1860. She composed a tender and moving epitaph which is engraved on his marble tomb and she mentioned his compassion for the afflicted (she may have been referring to herself, for she suffered from a mysterious form of epilepsy for many years). Around five and one-half years following Dr. Whatley's death, Susan Jane married (2) Robert Marshall Collier (b. 11-9-1814; d. 6-6-1895, buried in Mt. Zion Baptist Church Cemetery). (His first wife, Amanda Greene Collier had died. He also owned considerable property in that area of Georgia. He was considerably older than she and had children of her age. He was a successful businessman and apparently managed to keep intact the properties that came to him through his marriage to Susan Jane, during the difficult period and following the Civil War, the period of Reconstruction.)

Following the death of Susan Jane (Whatley) Collier's uncle, Wilson Whatley (1875), (at the home of her brother, Samuel Jones Whatley), R. M. Collier and brother-in-law, James Ferguson (husband of sister, Catherine E. (Whatley) (Watts) Ferguson), were permitted by the court to administer the estate of Wilson Whatley, and they managed the estate's properties for some eleven years. R. M. Collier became the "Guardian" of the children of Dr. James G. Whatley and paid taxes on the property left them by their father. R. M. Collier's photograph and other data pertaining to the Colliers may be found in the book, "History of Lamar County Georgia". Issue:

Seaborn Jones Whatley, son of Rev. Samuel Whatley (1762-1826) and Catharine (Anglin) Whatley, was born in Wilkes County, Georgia, Oct. 18, 1798; died Feb. 9, 1886, Harris County, Georgia; buried in the family cemetery located about nine miles east of Hamilton, Ga., married Martha Elizabeth Livingston, daughter of John and Elizabeth Livingston (Martha Elizabeth Livingston was born in Edgefield Dist., S.C., July 17, 1808; died July 18, 1868, buried in the family cemetery near Hamilton, Ga.); married Jan. 15, 1932, Harris County, Ga. Before settling in Harris County, Ga., Seaborn J. Whatley had worked as Surveyor and apparently, lived with his widowed mother and two orphaned nieces, daughters of his sister, Catharine A. Whatley and Taliaferro Livingston. Apparently, not long after Seaborn J. Whatley married and moved over to Harris County, c. 1833, his mother, Catharine Whatley, moved, with the two Livingston children, over to Pike County near her son and relatives there. It would appear that Seaborn Jones Whatley and his bride lived for approx. a year in Wilkes County, perhaps in the household of his mother, for their first child was born in Wilkes County. He, his wife, and infant son must have moved over to Harris County in 1833-4 and settled on land near what is now Hamilton, Georgia, where they lived until their deaths. He became a successful planter, served as Legislator for two terms, Justice of the Peace, Surveyor, and Reportedly was a veteran of Indian Wars. The old house in which he and his children and some grandchildren lived is still standing, located a short distance from the Ebenezer Baptist Church, which he helped to found. The house is typical of its day. It is built on a two-up and two-down plan with shed rooms added; it has a front porch and a foundation of enormous long, round logs. Some items of furniture passed to his granddaughter, Jimmie Mae Whatley, who died in a nursing home, in Macon, Ga. 1962. The Whatley Family Cemetery is located on the Ebenezer Road beyond the old King Place on the right side of the road, a few feet in woodland. Because of his age, Seaborn Jones Whatley did not serve in the military during the Civil War, however, he was appointed as a member of a "Family Welfare Group", under the "Provisions of Emergency" for Dowdell's Mill District.

A photograph of Seaborn Jones Whatley, and other data pertaining to his family, may be found in the book, "History of Harris County, Georgia", 1827-1961, by Louise Calhoun Barfield, Columbus, Ga., Columbus Office Supply Co. His bible was preserved until the year 1960 with the entry of both the births and deaths of his parents, Samuel and Catharine Whatley. Issue:

By 1857, he was made President of the Hamilton College, Hamilton, Ga. However, he left this post later to study law at Lebanon, Tenn. College (received degree 1859). In 1862, after the outbreak of the Civil War, he entered the service as Capt. of Company K(?), 3rd Georgia Cavalry. In 1868, he was elected a member of the Constitutional Convention and in 1879 and 1881, he represented Harris County in the General Assembly. He became a candidate for Congress in 1894 from the Fourth District in the convention held at Warm Springs, Georgia. I first bequeath my soul to God Almighty who gave it, my body to the earth to be buried in Christian like manner when it shall please God to call me out of this world, and for my worldly goods and estate, I bequeath in manner and form as follows:

Impress. I give unto MY SON, JOHN the one half of the land I live upon after my decease, and the other half after the decease of Ann, MY WIFE, with all edifices and buildings that shall then be upon it with all otherand appurtenances thereunto belonging and also one pewter basin and one Guine.

I give and bequeath unto MY SON, THOMAS, two hundred acres of land out of a parcel of land I purchased of Robt. Anthony Fulgham, joining upon the land of William Godwin, and one pewter basin.

I give and bequeath unto MY SON, WILLIAM, two hundred acres of land out of the aforesaid of land, purchased of the aforesaid Fulgham land taken out of that part of the land that joineth on Mr. William Liggett, also one pewter basin.

I give unto my DAUGHTER, ELIZABETH, one floral bed and rug colored green, one,one new pair of sheets and one pewter basin, one great pewter platter.

To my son-in-law JOHN WILLIAMS, I give one shilling.

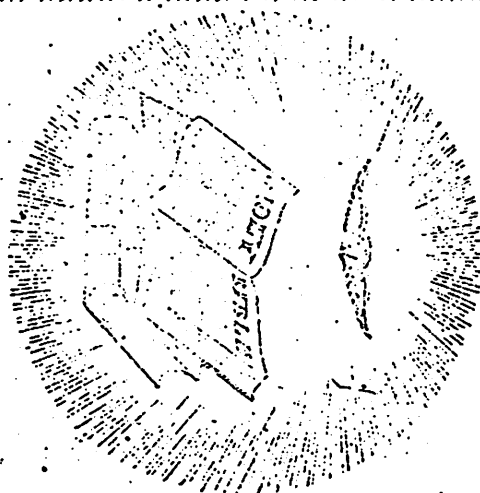
